Last week, our athletes represented Beaconsfield Primary School at the CDSSA Interschool Athletics Carnival. The carnival was held over two days, Wednesday 17 and Friday 19 October at Santich Park, Munster.

On Wednesday 17 October, Mr John, Mr Palermo and Mr Merry (Parent helper extraordinaire!) took our small but enthusiastic team to compete in the jumps, throws, 400m and 800m distance running events. Our athletes did their best and came away with several ribbons. Our place getters included Kai Stanbridge and Harry Beeley, who came second in the Boys' Intermediate Long Jump and T Ball Throw, respectively. AJ Merry finished third in the Boys' Open 400 metres, Division 1 and fourth in the Boys' 800 metres Open race. Zara Veverka came fourth in the Girls' Intermediate Long Jump. 


