Dear Beaconsfield Primary parents and caregivers

As you may have gathered from the communication over the last week, NAPLAN testing was certainly interesting. Luckily we didn't experience the level of connectivity issues reported by some schools from across the country. Interruptions were relatively minor and did not seem to impact upon the children's ability to complete the testing. Students who did experience technical issues have had the option to resit the affected test in a pen and paper format. I would like to acknowledge the work of Chris John in overseeing the process across the school. Managing the technology and testing platform added another layer of complexity to the logistics of test scheduling. I would like to also acknowledge our Year 3 and 5 teachers for their calm and competent approach. Students did not panic during interruptions and showed great resilience, supported by their teachers.

We are tracking our attendance, with the Business Plan target of improving our average attendance rate from 93% to 95%. Currently our rate is 94.4%. We know there are times when children need to stay home, and when they are sick, there is no better place than at home in bed. When students have been absent, for whatever reason, please let the school know via a phone call, the website, Connect or MSGU. At this stage of the year, we still have 260 unexplained absences, or 36% of all absences. Notifying the school allows us to account for these absences and fulfil our duty of care to our students.

Year 5s Science Activity Tuesday Week 3

This term in Science the Year 5s in Room 16 have been focussing on Earth and Space Science, in particular how the Earth is part of a system of planets that orbit around the sun. The challenge was for the rest of the Year 5s to organise the planets based on their scaled distance from the sun. The whole class was involved in the measuring process and came up with effective and accurate ways of measuring.



To ensure everyone was able to be a part of the solar system, the Year 5s came up with the brilliant idea for the remaining students becoming the asteroid belt located between the first and last four planets of the solar system. The students had a great day learning about the scaled distance and relative size of planets.
