# AFL practical skills session – Fremantle College

On Monday 26 August, Michelle Traynor, PE, Health and AFL Teacher at Fremantle College, came to Beaconsfield Primary School to do an AFL clinic with the Year 6 students.

At 2pm, the Year 6 students went down to the bottom oval to meet Ms Traynor and start the clinic. We also met three students who are in the AFL program. We were placed in to groups of two and practised some ball handling skills, such as hand passing, catching, and some other stuff. We then practised kicking and Ms Traynor told us about a guy called Buddy Franklin who has a terrible kicking form, but he is one of the best goal kickers in the AFL.

After twenty minutes of kicking the ball and making some incredible marks, the three students from Fremantle College split us up into six different groups. There were six different cones, and if you were number one, you would go to the first cone, number two, the second cone, and so on.

We played a really fun game in which you would jump up and try to hit the football to your teammates, and you would have to handpass the ball around five times before you could try to handpass the ball into the goals.
