Mobile Phone in Schools Policy

Last week, the State Government announced a new Student Mobile Phones in Public Schools policy to take effect from the start of Term 1, 2020.

The policy requires all public schools to implement a ban on the use of mobile phones for all students from the time they arrive at school to the end of the school day. This extends to the use of smart watches which need to be on aeroplane mode during this period. This has been introduced to;

- reduce the potential for learning distraction,
- protect the privacy of staff and students,
- improve health and wellbeing of students, and
- reduce opportunities for cyberbullying during school hours.

The requirements for primary students are;

- Kindergarten to Year 6 students are not permitted to have mobile phones in their possession during the school day, and
- if a student brings a mobile phone to school, they must be stored in a place determined by the school.

As we already have a phone use policy that meets these minimum requirements, there will be no changes for our school. Our existing policy will remain in effect. This is available on our website.
