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#### **Positive Behaviour Support**

In the National School Opinion Survey (NSOS) carried out in late 2018, a clear theme emerged from all three stakeholder groups (students, parents and staff); clear and consistent behavioural/cultural expectations for all students in all areas of Beaconsfield PS. In the wake of this survey, the decision was made to pursue the WA Department of Education's positive behaviour program called Positive Behaviour Support (PBS).

Throughout 2019, the PBS team worked in consultation with staff and students to develop three core values to replace the previous five. These values not only include the previous values in their essence but also build on the values we want to see in Beaconsfield PS students. These values are:

- **Considerate** (building on respect for ourselves, others and equipment as well as thinking of others and other options)
- **Courageous** (building on persistence and resilience while including the pursuit of personal excellence)
- **Community** (building on honesty and responsibility to make out groups, classes, year levels and school in general a better place)

These values fit together in our new school motto:
