Dear Beaconsfield Primary School community

Thank you to everyone for your support in what has been an interesting start to Term 2. The constant updates and changes in direction have kept us all on our toes. I have been incredibly grateful for the flexibility and resilience demonstrated by our staff. They left Term 1 with one set of plans and quickly amended these by the end of the holidays. This is now more vital than ever with numerous children and parents using this as an entry point into the school

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I would like to acknowledge the wonderful efforts of Julia Reay, Pam Dunstall, Celeste Franklin and Nicola Flowers who form our online home learning team. For those students at home, they will be a familiar face. They are implementing the plans devised by our teaching staff at the end of last term and support students at home with their learning. With additional students returning to school next week, there may be changes to the online teacher responsible for each year level, and you will be informed if there are any alterations. We know that Connect has been slow and we apologise for this. Unfortunately Connect has been put under pressure with so many schools utilising it. We are mindful of the delay in messages coming through and are working to rectify this.

You may have heard that our student toilets are being refurbished as part of the State Government's 'School Maintenance Blitz'. I have been assured that they should be completed by the end of today. Thankfully, with reduced numbers and staggered break times, we have managed with a limited number of toilets for the first three days. We are looking forward to newly fitted out toilets to begin next week!


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
