Freddo wants to get out from the bottom of the well. Each day, he climbs 3m up the wall of




the well and then rests. But the wall is slippery and he then slips down 1m. The next day he does the same thing. In fact he does this every day until he gets out of the well.

Jim has ten tiles with a different digit on each of them.


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He makes a lot of five-digit numbers that are divisible by five.
