Dear Beaconsfield Primary School Community

Welcome back to Term 4. It is wonderful to be back and we are mindful of how quick the year is progressing. This has been compounded by the fact that we are in the process of organising Year 6 graduation activities – where has the time gone?

On Tuesday 26 October, we will be hosting a Think U Know parent session. The program is a partnership between the Australian Federal Police, State Police, Microsoft and other organisations, and aimed at addressing topics, such as online grooming and exploitation. As a school, we are frequently dealing with issues created by students accessing inappropriate material or engaging in activities, out of school hours, that place them at risk. I urge all parents to attend, no matter what age their child is, so that as a community, we can proactivity address this. The Year 3-6 students will also be engaged in sessions with local police throughout the week, which will complement and reinforce the messages from the parent session.
