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
Congratulations to the following people for giving the Brainiacs questions a go last fortnight. They are gaining PBS points even at home:

Ryan and Patrick Hew – Superstars! NUMERO CHALLENGE!

As an addition this term, we have a Numero Challenge for you. Numero is a great Mental Maths game that we play in classes and really develops number flexibility skills. For more information visit https://www.numero.org/

The first challenge is learning 'The Take'. A **take** is when a single Number Card from your hand is matched to a card, or combination of cards, equalling the same number in the centre.

The cards in the **take** and the matching card from the hand are then placed face down on the table near the player. This is your 'winning pile' and these cards are counted at the end of the game to determine the winner. The hand is restored to five cards from the deck. Although you may use only **one Number Card** from your hand, you may win any cards from the centre that equal, or combine to equal, a single card in your hand. What 'take' could you do from the situations below?


