Dear Beacy

It wouldn't surprise anyone that school staff would see a forecast of cold, wet weather after a long weekend and be somewhat apprehensive about the week ahead. Having said that, our kids made the best of whatever situation they were in this week; they got out and ran some energy off when they weather permitted, and did fun inside things when it didn't. They also leant into the Crazy Hair Day theme they earned by reaching the first collective target of 1000 PBS points for each faction. 2000 points earns extra play, and 3000 would result in a PJ Day that would suit the weather perfectly.

Thank you to the 126 community members who completed the School Culture Survey in the last few weeks. There is a clear appetite in the parent body to understand and contribute to the operational and strategic direction of the school, and we're fortunate to have Department of Education surveys like this and the National School Opinion Survey (NSOS) that we've completed in the past that provide valuable feedback on our service delivery.

One hint of a thread that came up in the survey's comments as well as the aggregated scores was the community's understanding of the role of the School Board. There are some misconceptions that the School Board is a decision-making organisation that has control over the school's operational and strategic actions. At their core, School Boards are in fact all about governance rather than making decisions. The main functions are to meet at least twice a year to formally note the school's financial figures and Annual Report, approve each year's booklists and contributions & charges, collaborate with school staff and leadership to monitor progression towards school targets, and promote the school within the community (more about the Board can be found **here** on our website). Literally everything else is the responsibility of school leadership, so talking to a Board member about changing a duty area or an area of the curriculum won't get you far. Based on the feedback in the survey we will be introducing some measures over the course of Semester 2 to improve awareness of the board and channel parent questions or concerns to the relevant audience.

NUMERO CHALLENGE!

As an addition this term, we have a Numero Challenge for you. Numero is a great Mental Maths game that we play in classes and really develops number flexibility skills. For more information visit https://www.numero.org/

The next move is a **build**. It is not always possible to **take**. If you cannot **take**, you try to **build**. A **build** is when a card from the hand is added to a single card, or combination of cards, from the centre. This creates a new number, ready for a later **take**. When you build, you MUST have the answer in your hand in a single card.

What 'take' could you do from the situation below?



HAND

Pre-Primary, Year 1s and 2s

Jennie the old sheep dog is lazing around in the paddock near the house.

She **counts the number of animals** in the paddock. There are 11 of them, pigs and ducks.

Then she counts the legs. She sees 28 legs. How many ducks are there?



Year 3s and 4s

Play the strategy game "take two".



Place five counters in a row.

With a partner take turns, removing one or two counters each turn.

The person to remove the last counter is the winner.

Can you find a **game strategy** so that the first player always win?

Is this a fair game? [In a fair game, each player has an equal chance of winning.]

Year 5s and 6s

Take any five numbers between 1 and 99 inclusive. Write them in **ascending** order. Now add the first and the second; the second and the third; the third and the fourth; and the fourth and the fifth.

Score points as follows: every square number is worth two points; every cube number is worth 3 points; every prime number is worth 2 points. (Numbers that are both squares and cubes only get 3 points.) What is the **highest** score that you can get? In how many ways can you get it?

Well done to everyone for reaching our first target of 1000 PBS points, which was Crazy Hair Day.









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
Our next target is 2000 points, which means everyone will get an extra 10 minutes play time.


