There are a couple of important staffing matters that are worth mentioning. The first is the departure of our universally loved and highly respected School Psychologist Tanya Howarth at the end of this term. Tanya has been a fixture of the school for almost 15 years so is well overdue for a change of scenery, regardless of how much the staff and families who have had the benefit of experiencing her services will miss her.

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Tanya's contribution to the success of the school over a long period of time is immeasurable and I know I speak for Kirsten as well when I say her experience and advice during challenging periods makes being the principal much easier. Tanya will be back for handover with out new School Psychologist Kat Misic in Week 1 of Term 4 but will be sorely missed after that.
The last personnel matter to clarify is the currently advertised permanent principal role. For those who may have missed it at the end of last year, when Kirsten Dicker accepted the principal position at West Leederville PS at the end of Term 4 । had already signed a 12-month fixed term extension at Beaconsfield. With that contract coming to an end in December, the role must be advertised to the public so all interested parties can apply in accordance with public sector guidelines. I will be applying, however there are no guarantees due to the fact that anyone in the industry with any level of experience can apply for the role. Our Board Chair, Dan Coffey, is on the selection panel and is open to hearing from members of the community with their thoughts on what they would like to see happen with the principal role from 2024 onwards. The advertisement closes on Monday 18 September and the panel is aiming to have the process completed by the middle of next term. ## Art Room News

Remember there are two reasons all the great artwork that has been created in class hasn't come home yet; firstly, because we have been stockpiling in preparation for the grand exhibition in Fremantle early next term!! Secondly, we have been working in sketch books.

My classes have been working with themes of nature, feelings and colour, sometimes with all three overlapping!

We have used these to develop awareness of the world around us, and our internal world. Focus in art leads us to find moments of calm (and fun) amongst our busy days.

We have tried so many different things: Printmaking with poetry, painting, ceramics and drawing out in the fresh air outdoors.

We have learnt so much about colour: We've mixed warm and cool colours and made secondary colours from the three primary colours. Collectively we made over 800 shades of green in one lesson, using only blue and yellow!
We've explored how colours can be used to spark emotions and to express emotions, but
that it's a very individual thing and each of us have different opinions on this.
It's exciting to see how unique each person's art works are, and how everyone is growing and developing and looking after the art room.
