Late last term, many of our students participated in our annual Dad's Camp. Even though on the first night, many of our families had to brave some very windy conditions, the event was a massive success.


I was able to pop over for a quick visit and spend some time at the camp this year which was great. I was so impressed to see the engagement from the adults and excitement and joy from our students.




2026 Enrolments Open
