Year 1 – 3 Challenge

"Magic Number Machine"

Here are some clues of what it does:

- If you put in 5, you get 12.

What is the machine doing to the numbers? Can you figure out the rule?

Bonus Challenge: Make up your own grocery store with prices. Give your family a \$50 budget and see what they can "buy"!

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
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PBS UPDATE


