2026 VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

The financial support of parents is valued and plays a significant role in providing resources that contribute to creating educational opportunities for all students to be successful. The funds enable the purchase of resources to enhance teaching and learning environment at Beaconsfield Primary School.

The Education Act 1999 requires schools to notify parents of the schedule of Voluntary Contributions and Charges for 2026 which have been endorsed by the Beaconsfield Primary School Board. The schedule is divided in sections and will allow you to calculate all costs that may be incurred throughout the year.

1. School Voluntary Contribution: \$60 per student (equates to \$15 per term/\$1.50 per week)

The total amount of contributions parents/caregivers are being asked to pay has been contained within the \$60.00 maximum set in the School Education Regulation 2000.

Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure in the delivery of the Western Australian Curriculum. Examples of the learning areas where resources and consumables might be purchased are listed below:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- HaSS
- Technologies
- Health & Physical Education
- The Arts
- Language Other Than English (Italian)
- Library
- Information & Communication Technology

These contributions are voluntary however; the quality of our teaching and learning program will be enhanced when every family makes a contribution to the cost of supplementary funding gained from other sources including the State and Federal Governments. Payment can be made using following options:

- **A single payment** with the Personal Items List (Booklist) – the preferred supplier, Campion, sends the contributions and charges to the school with a list of names (**preferred option**).
- **A single payment** using the Online Payment System – Electronic Banking – see contributions and charges sheet for bank account details.
- **A single payment** through the Administration Office – Eftpos/Credit Card or cash.

2. Extra Cost Options (Charges): See over page for further details.

Activities that enrich the educational program will be offered to students throughout the year. Student participation in an activity will be conditional on payment as these activities are not covered by the voluntary contribution. The schedule of these charges is outlined on the following page. As in the past, payment will be requested for each activity as it approaches, or you may opt to pay the charges upfront for 2026 with any unspent balance carrying over to the following year.

3. Specific Learning Programs: See over page for further details.

A breakdown of Specific Learning Programs is outlined on the following page. Please note that these amounts should only be added to your child's total if participating e.g PEAC, IMSS.

4. Personal Items List for Students Use (Section 108):

All students K-6 will receive a Personal Items List for their 2026 year level. These items are for their personal use and used in lessons e.g stationery items, calculators, workbooks etc. It will be necessary to replace some items, such as pencils, pens, glue throughout the year and parents are encouraged to check these each term and replenish when necessary. Items may be purchased from Campion or any retail outlet of your choice.

5. Other Requirements

Some other personal use items may need to be purchased and are listed below. These items are optional and will vary from student to student:

- School Uniform
- Year 6 Graduation Shirt
- School Photographs
- Book Fair
- Scholastic Book Club
- Assembly Costumes

6. P&C Voluntary Contribution

The P&C rely on your Voluntary Contributions of \$55 per student to deliver their program of free school community events as well as enhancing our students' school experience via projects including playground upgrades, large-scale murals, yarning circle and important student resources such as decodable readers and inter school shirts.

7. Financial Arrangements

Statements will be issued throughout the year to inform parents of payments that are outstanding. Families who are experiencing financial hardship are invited to contact the Principal or Manager Corporate Services to discuss payment options.

PEAC Year 5 & 6 Students	'The South Metropolitan Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC) program provides extension and challenge opportunities for students deemed as eligible through state-wide testing in Year 4. Eligible Year 4 students have an opportunity to engage in an introductory event called 'Ignite' at a maximum cost of \$50. As students transition to Year 5 and 6, eligible PEAC students have the opportunity to engage in optional courses between \$15-100 per cycle (trimester). The maximum annual combined contribution, depending on course selections by parents and students is \$300.'							
Instrumental Music Year 5 & 6	Maximum cost for Instrument Hire \$125 If your child has been chosen to play an instrument, purchase of an instrument is required for some levels.
